PROFDEV #2: JOB PREP & EXPERIENCE

REFLECT ON YOUR EXPERIENCES

(1) What kind of work or professional experience do you currently have? List your top 3

- Internships or Co-Ops
- Experience – Leadership, service, study abroad
- Projects – Class, research, independent

TIP: Make sure these are easily found on your resume and that you practice how you'll talk about them on interviews (see next slide)

STAR: SUMMARIZING YOUR EXPERIENCES

S

Situation - Tell the interviewers the **general context** (is it an example from class, an extracurricular club, or an internship) and what **your role** was in the situation (team leader, club president, intern, etc.)

T

Task - Briefly explain **what task you were trying to accomplish** (e.g., *“I was working on a class project with 3 other classmates and I was the team lead. We had to develop a mid-fidelity prototype of a smart phone app using the Sketch prototyping software”*)

A

Action - Specifically explain **what you did in the situation**. It's common for IST students to frequently say “we” because we work in teams so much – And you can include the work you did collaboratively with your other teammates, but the interviewers also want to know specifically what you did in the situation

R

Result - End with the **result** of the situation. Most people forget this part because it seems obvious to them, but it's not always obvious to the interviewer. It's also a good time to **summarize what you learned** from the experiences.

ANTICIPATE WHAT THEY ARE LOOKING FOR

(2) What are the top 3 things you believe recruiter/interviewers in your area are looking for?

- GPA and experience
- Specific criteria/skills listed on the job description
- The right “fit”

TIP: Go through your resume - See how your GPA, experience, and skill set matches against their job description. Look at their website, mission statement, company culture, etc. and see how you can best present yourself as a good “fit” for them (and if they’re a good fit for you)

THE INTERVIEW

(3) When preparing for a job interview, what are 3 tasks you do to get ready for the interview?

- Know the **company**
- Know the **job**
- Know the **interviewer** (if possible)
- Know your **resume** and how to **talk about it** in a way that fits with the above – **Practice!**
- Other advice?

THE INTERVIEW

(4) What is the hardest questions you've ver been asked on an interview?

- Stress questions
- Skill-testing or problem-solving questions/tasks
- Behavioral-based questions – “*Tell me a time when...*”
- Hypothetical questions – “*How would you...*”
- Creativity or “random” questions

ADVICE AND MENTORING

(5) What is the biggest piece of advice you would give IST/SRA freshman about prepping for the job market?

Be specific in your own answers!

- Try to mentor and advise those who are less experienced – What do you wish someone told you?
- Think about being an IST/SRA alumni mentor post-graduation
- Consider being a recruiter or interviewer for your own company – You learn a lot!
